Last year, MASH Ministries was able to start a first responder snack drive. We are currently planning our second drive with our community. We look forward to being a blessing to those first responders who are working tirelessly to protect our community.

Almost all of the silent auction baskets sold and Paul was able to share his story and heart for MASH during the dinner. What a great night for the gala.
